Stand out points from the discussion

We live in a society where the gap between the rich and poor is ever increasing and we seem to accept that as normal

As a society we need to switch our empathy back on. This can be helped by remembering homelessness isn't something that only happens to other people or is a character flaw. It could affect any person and is an issue of social policy failure.

We also need to build empathy into our systems, to ensure they act as the safety net for people who are going through tough times.

Lived experience is really key in creating empathy between service deliverer and user, but class difference continues to be a barrier.

Availability of good quality housing and support through services and also the community is important but continues to be an issue. Affordability is a problem for many and it seems we are building the wrong type of housing in Manchester (not affordable) and not using all of our buildings to address the issue of homelessness.

Should we give money to people who are homeless? No right or wrong answer. Think about what you would want if you were in that position. But if you don't want to give directly, there are charities to donate to. Interestingly most of the panel said they have given money directly (including Anthony who had previously been homeless).

Politics is the answer but we have become apathetic as a society.

Differing views about the language we use around homelessness – does it matter?

Need to think about how we get the film out wider 😂




Homelessness is not a lifestyle choice – people who have extremely

I will keep working hard to challenge inequality
Go to work

Work through your fear and anxiety and brighten up someone's day
I will be more vocal when I hear people describe homelessness as a choice
Promote more of what our services do
Person centred
Hold people accountable
Promote the film and suggest options for change or ask others what action they will take
Speak with homeless not about them. Being homeless but also about other topics have a positive chat we are all human
Deliver the message of empathy throughout my meetings
Use my 'rich' contacts to help open shelters
Film comms – who can help? Who can influence? How can this be used for the greater good?
Sit and eat with a person who is homeless

Time and dedication
Tell my 26 year old friends about it, and my 8 year old niece
Challenge our politicians! Grass root change is not enough!!
Made me reflect on what else I can do from the simplest of things – talking about the issues to people affected
Volunteer at a food bank
Speak directly to people I see on the street – I've sometimes felt that they wouldn't want me to talk to them
More consciously
Sometimes it is alright to close and open empathy. But people sometimes don't think. What if you become homeless?
We need to learn to shut our mouths and just bloody LISTEN
Never just walk by and teach my children the importance of why!
Stop passing by
Volunteer at a local hostel
Stop selling our council housing
Share the film, share the website, share the song

Give people choice on how I can help
I'm going to talk to people outside my local Spar and find out who they are and what their hopes are

Ask people what they need and want
